As our new Lions year begins, our first duty is to pay tribute to IPDG Randy for his great year. For the first time in many years District 33N had a **net** membership gain. Let us catch this momentum and continue it into the future. In addition, last year produced the second largest contribution level ever to Mass. Lions Eye Research fund, with total donations of \$289,716.13. This was by far the best per capita contribution rate in the state. District S, with its 50% larger membership, slightly exceeded the District N total. But, more importantly, total donations to MLERF were up for the year reversing a downward trend from the last few years. Congratulations, Randy, you truly inspired outstanding efforts within District 33N.

This year's International theme is "Move to Grow". The theme I had chosen, "Go for Growth", is both similar sounding and in theory. Growth is not limited to looking at membership, although that is a key component. Rather growth in this case stresses increased or strengthened community services and donations both within the communities we serve and the Lions charities we so solidly support. If we accomplish membership growth, it becomes so much easier to accomplish the other growth objectives. Do what Lions always do, watch for potential members and service opportunities and each will feed upon the other.

We will take our first steps toward ongoing growth in membership by having the Global Membership Team consultants here in early October. The second and third of October will be training sessions and recruitment will take place over the three days following. Our goals from this visit are: to form one or two new clubs; to bolster membership in weaker clubs; and, most importantly, to begin to develop a long-range in district training program to promote membership, extension and retention. This program development has been assigned to the Vice-Governors and is a key function of theirs this year. More information will be forthcoming as the plans develop. Please, help us help the District. Do what you can to make this a highly successful effort.

In closing, it is my pleasure to serve the Lions of District 33N for the year 2009-2010. I will make my best effort to do anything I can to help any Lions Club both this year and into the future.

Wirfs, of Kelkheim am Taunus, Hessen, Germany, was elected president of The International Association of Lions Clubs at the association's 92nd International Convention, held in Minneapolis, Minnesota, USA, July 6-10, 2009. Lions Clubs International is the world's largest service club organization and the global leader in humanitarian and community service.

President Wirfs, an entrepreneur and retired CEO of his own company, is a pioneer in the marketing of frozen food specialties across Europe.

Using as his presidential theme **Move to Grow**, President Wirfs plans to build momentum or movement and "grow" association membership in order to meet the increasing needs for community service around the world.

President Wirfs is an experienced and effective leader with particular strength in membership development and extension and leadership training, and in combining service and fellowship.

A member of the Hofheim am Taunus Lions Club since 1985, President Wirfs has held many offices within the association, including club president; district governor; council chairperson; faculty group leader for the District Governors-elect Seminar, which trains incoming governors; and international director. He served as CEO of the German Lions Foundation, Deutsches Hilfswerk. In addition, he systematically implemented Lions Quest, a mentoring program for young people, in Germany. He is an honorary member of the Kelkheim am Taunus Lions Club.

In recognition of his service to the association, President Wirfs has received numerous awards, including the Ambassador of Good Will Award, the highest honor the association bestows upon its members. He is also a Progressive Melvin Jones Fellow.

President Wirfs and his wife, Margit, also a Melvin Jones Fellow, have two sons. Oliver and daughter-in-law, Sandra, have one daughter, Hannah-Carlotta. Marcus is married to Pauline, who is from France.
